A radio is assembled and fixed to the roof liner, along with a rear view mirror and a pair of sun visors.

YOUR MODEL

You will be building a 1:8 scale replica of a customised 1973 Ford Falcon XB GT. Features include a lift-up bonnet that reveals a detailed engine, opening doors, wind-down windows and an 'active' steering wheel. A remote-control fob illuminates the main lights, brake lights and indicators.

All parts belong to a kit. Collectors' item for adults. Not suitable for children under 14. Some parts may have sharp edges, please handle them with care.

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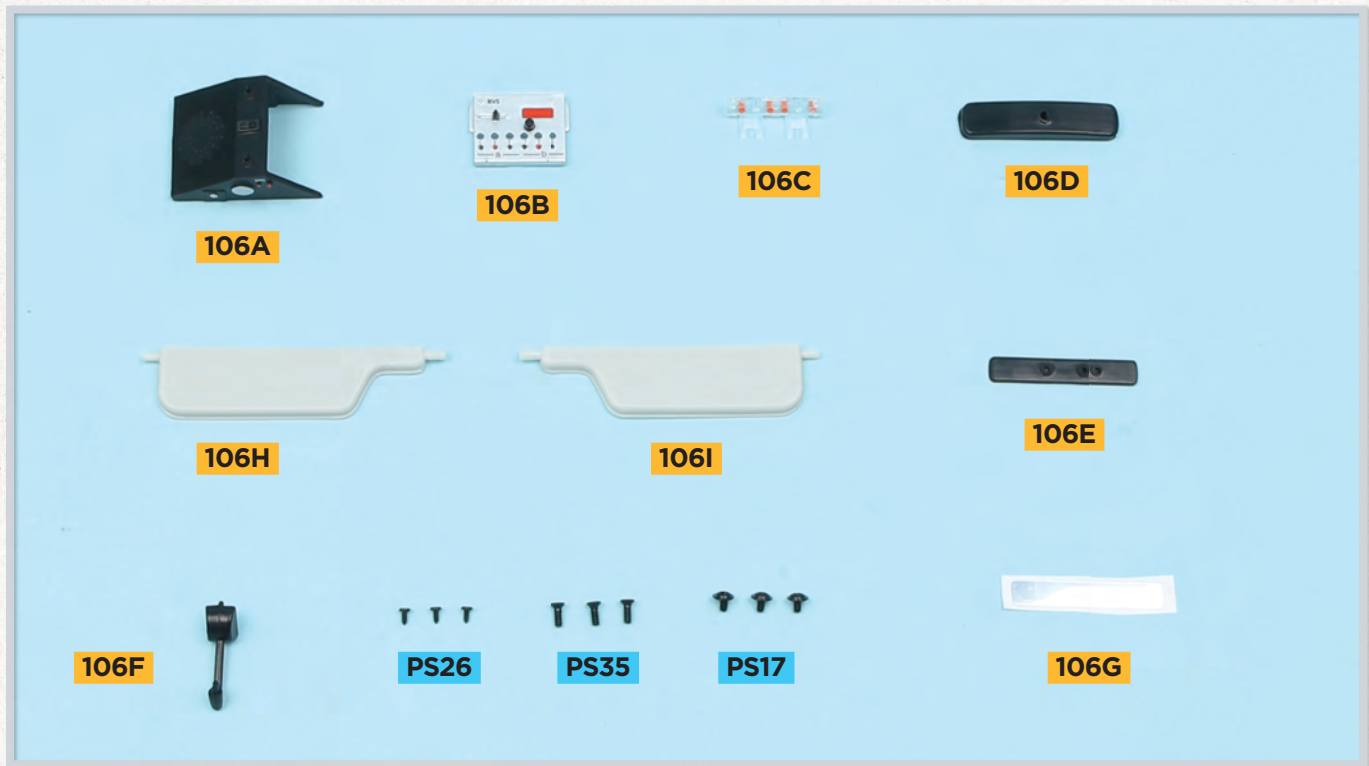
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Stage 106: Roof Liner Details

A radio is assembled and fixed to the roof liner, along with a rear view mirror and sun visors.

PS35 Three* 1.8 x 5mm PB screws

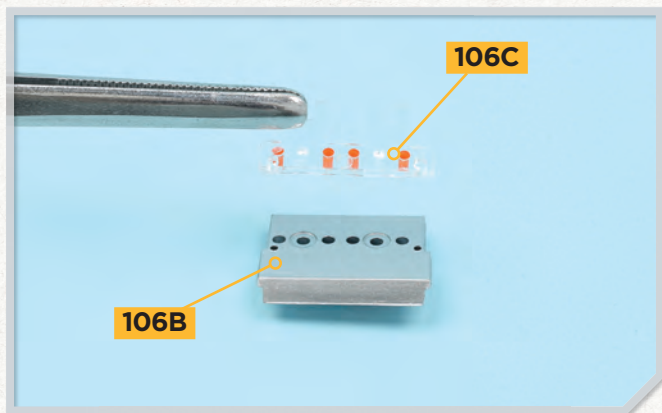
PS17 Three* 1.8 x 3mm PWB screws

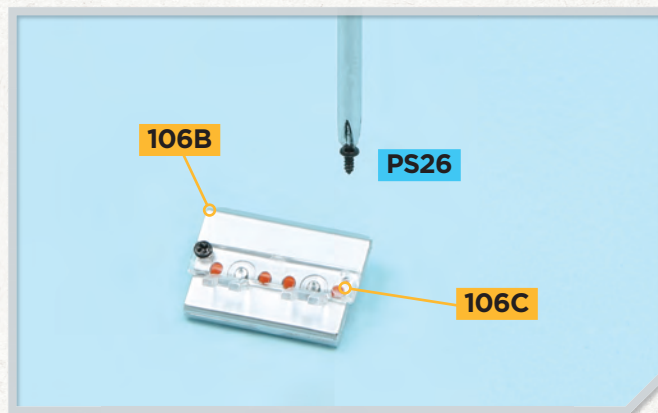


Stage 106: Roof Liner Details



STEP 1

Take the lighting strip **106C** and fit it into the row of holes in the front of the radio **106B**.

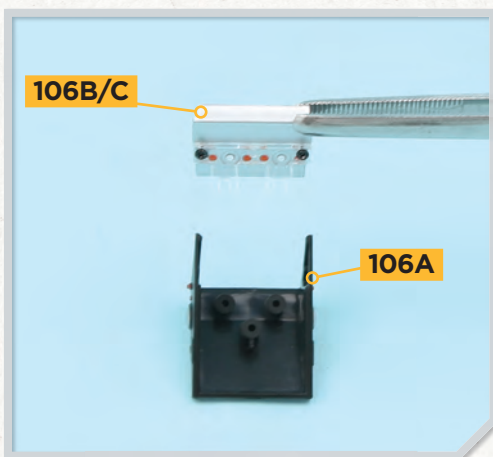


STEP 2

Fix the lights in place with two **PS26** screws (circled).

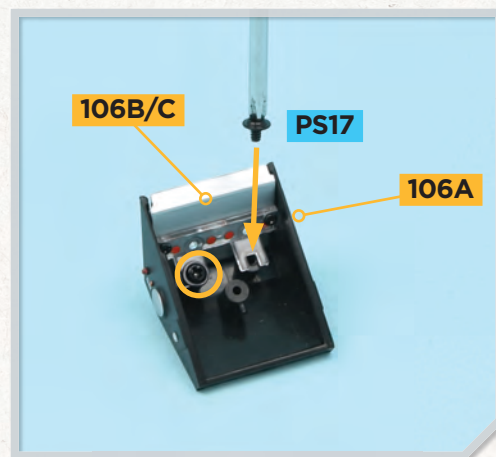
EXPERT TIP

When handling the radio housing part **106A**, take care not to damage the two small switches on the angled face of the part (shown circled, below).



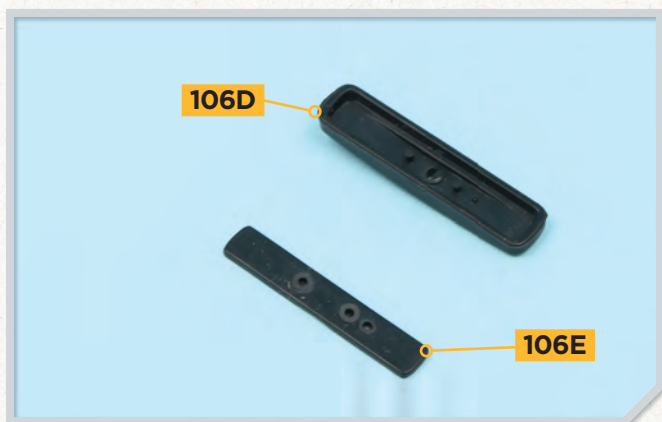
STEP 3

Fit the front of the radio **106B/C** into the radio housing **106A**.



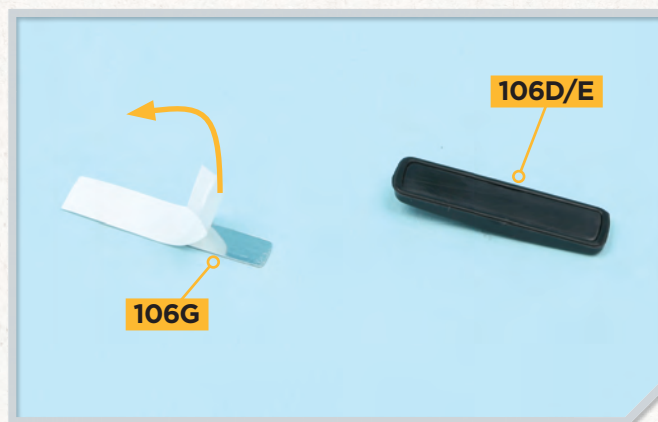
STEP 4

Fix the front of the radio **106B/C** in place with two **PS17** screws.



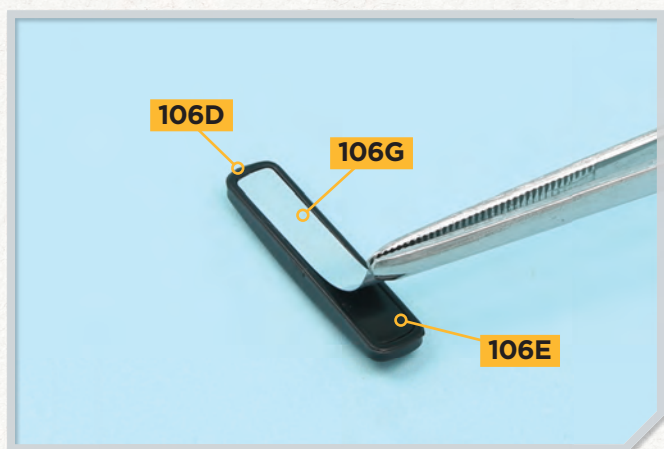
STEP 5

Take the mirror backing panel **106E** and fit it into the frame **106D**. This is a push-fit connection.



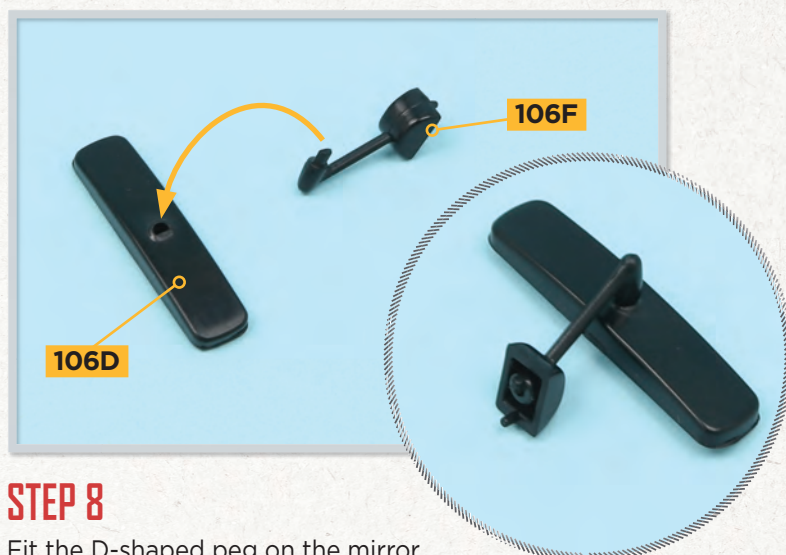
STEP 6

Carefully peel the backing off the mirror sticker **106G**.



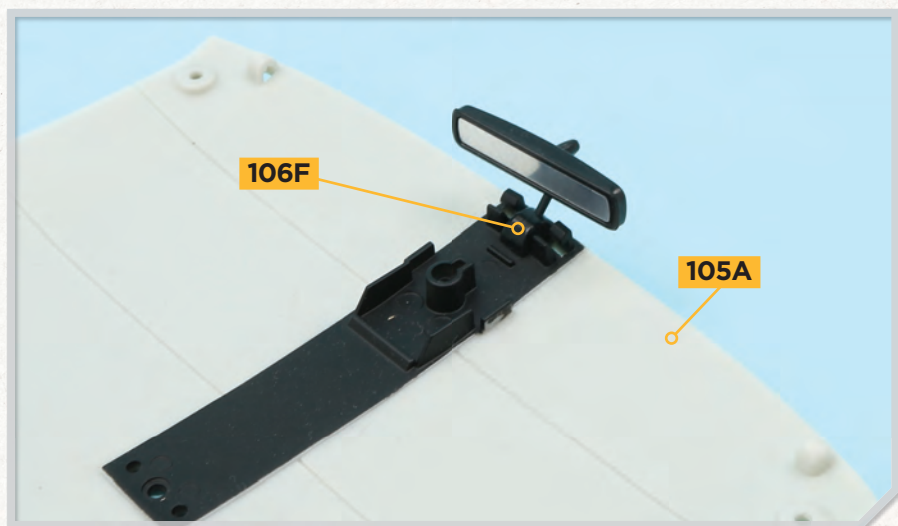
STEP 7

Carefully stick the mirror **106G** to the mirror panel **106E** so that it fits inside the frame **106D**.



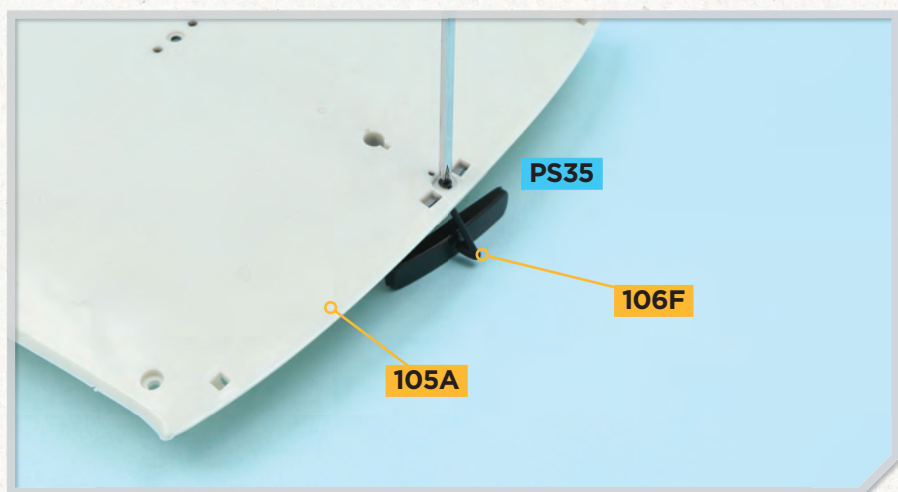
STEP 8

Fit the D-shaped peg on the mirror support **106F** into the hole in the back of the mirror frame **106D**. This is a push-fit connection.



STEP 9

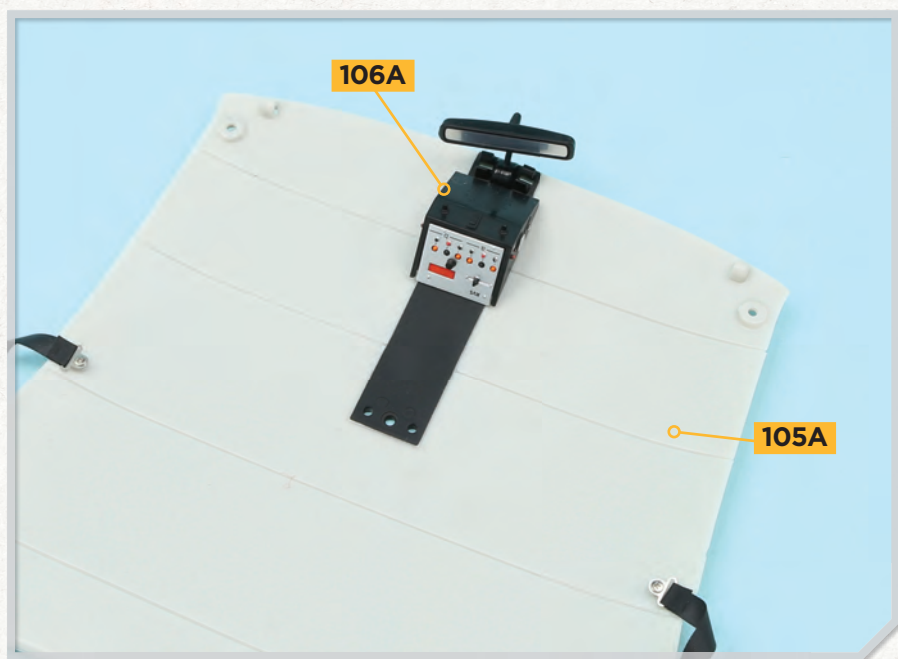
Fit the shaped end of the mirror support **106F** into the corresponding recess in the centre front of the strip on the roof liner **105A**.



STEP 10

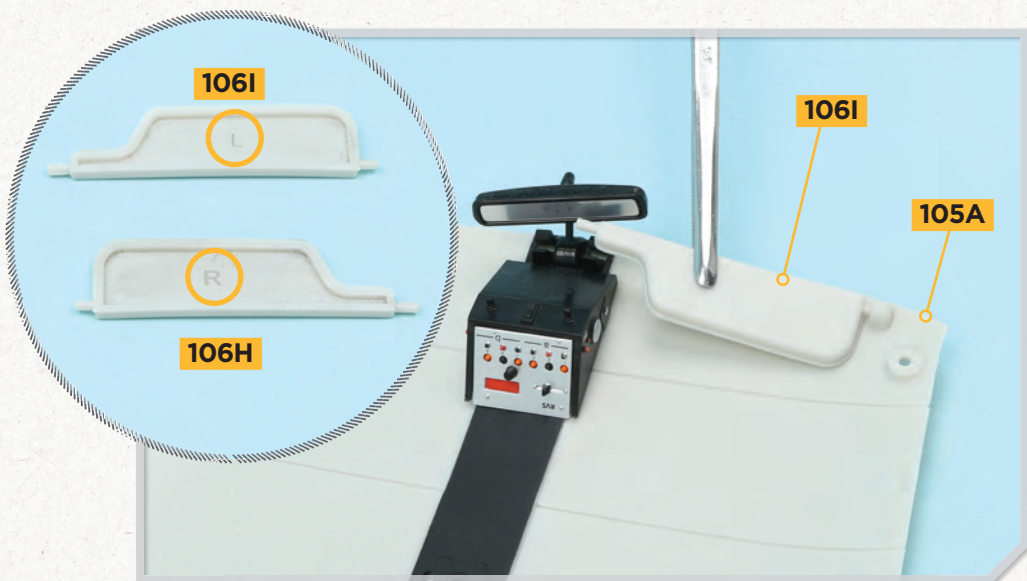
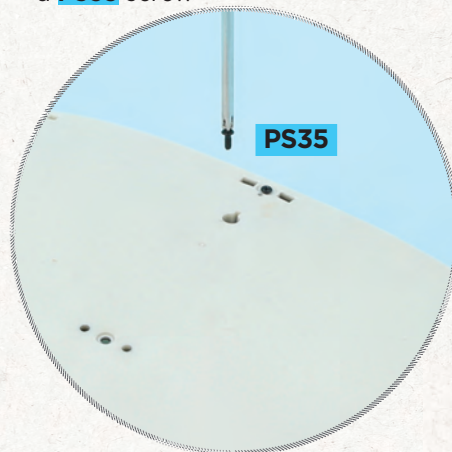
Holding the mirror in place, carefully turn the assembly over so that you can fix the support in place with a **PS35** screw.

Stage 106: Roof Liner Details



STEP 11

Fit the radio in place so that the shaped raised screw socket on part **106A** fits into the shaped socket in the strip on the liner **105A**. Turn the assembly over and fix in place with a **PS35** screw



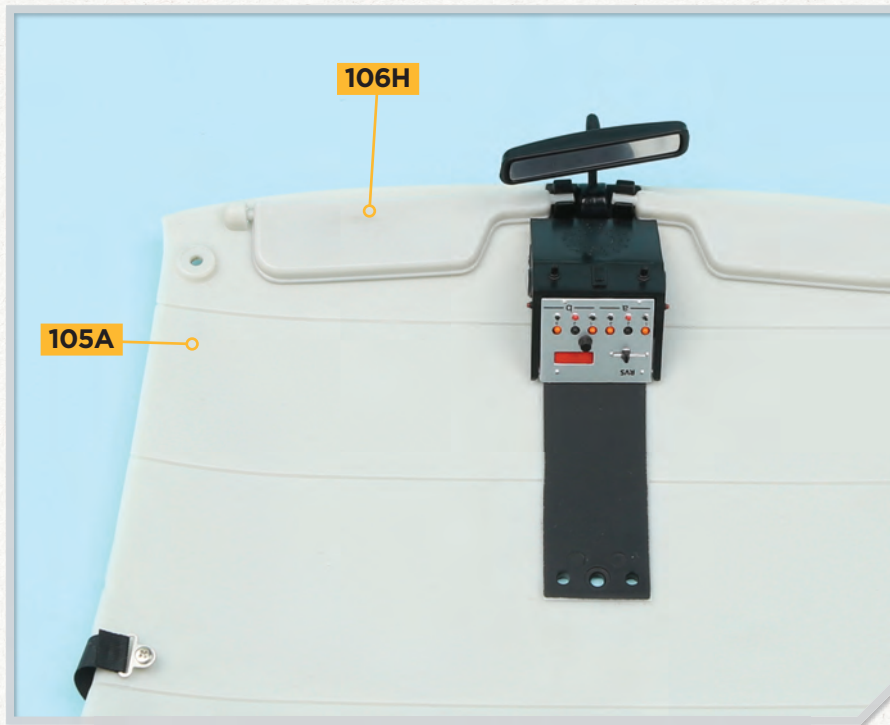
STEP 12

Note that the sun visors **106I** and **106H** are marked L and R (inset). Take the left visor **106I** and fit the peg on the end into the socket at the front left corner of the roof liner **105A**. (Note that in this photo the liner is upside down, so the socket is on the right.)



STEP 13

Push the peg on the other end of the visor **106I** between the raised grips on the centre strip of the roof liner **105A**.



STEP 14

Similarly, fit the right-hand visor **106H** to the right-hand side of the roof liner **105A**.

COMPLETED ASSEMBLY

The rear view mirror, radio and sun visors have been fitted to the roof liner.

A light is fitted to the roof liner and the roof liner is fixed inside the car. A spoiler is attached to the roof.
