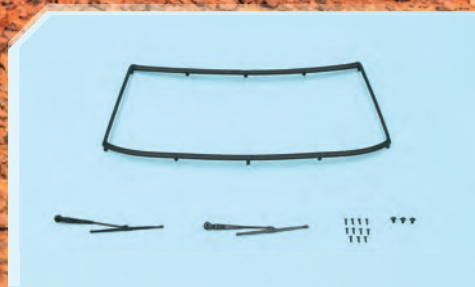

The windscreen is fixed in place and windscreen wipers are attached.

YOUR MODEL

You will be building a 1:8 scale replica of a customised 1973 Ford Falcon XB GT. Features include a lift-up bonnet that reveals a detailed engine, opening doors, wind-down windows and an 'active' steering wheel. A remote-control fob illuminates the main lights, brake lights and indicators.

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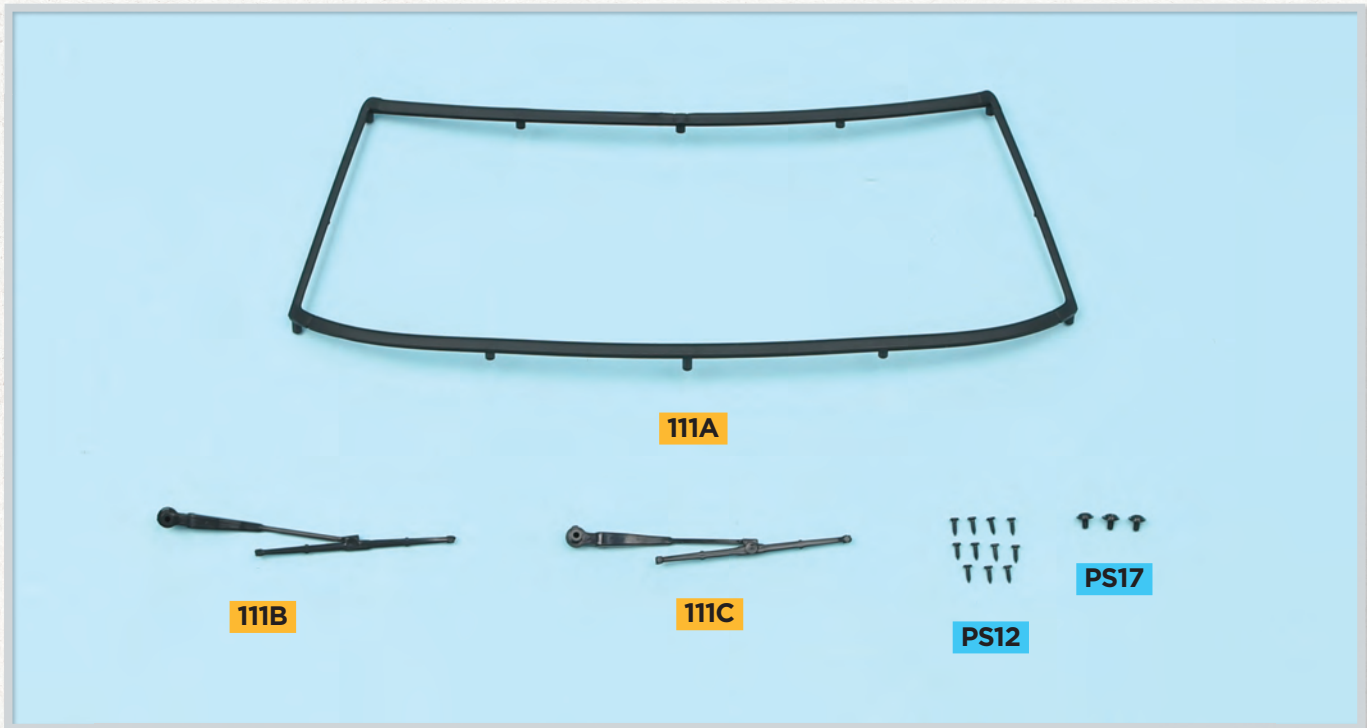
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Stage 11: Windscreen Wipers

The windscreen is fixed in place and windscreen wipers are fitted to the model.



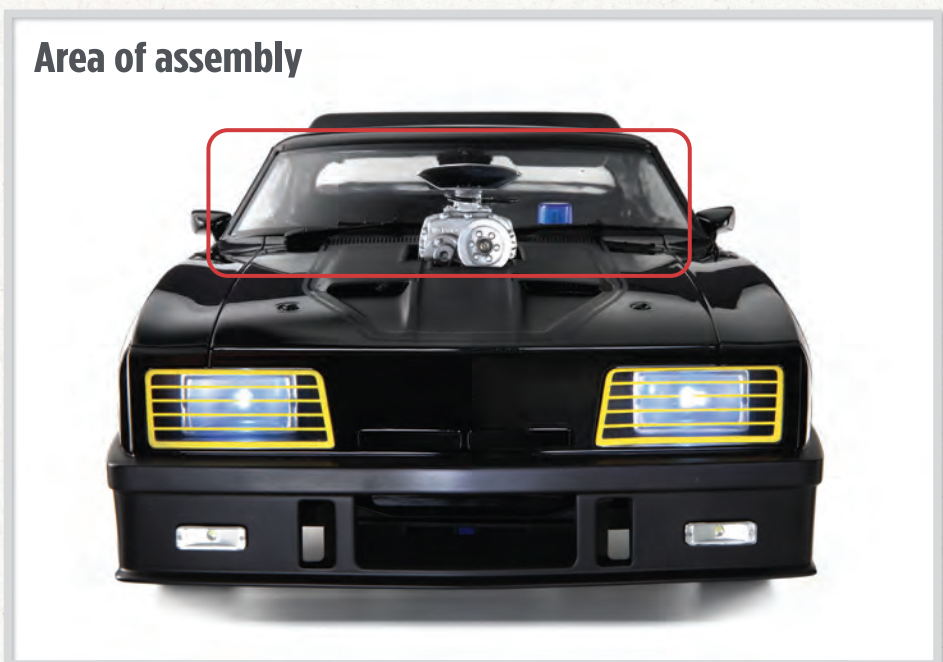
List of parts:

- 111A** Windscreen trim
- 111B** Left windscreen wiper
- 111C** Right windscreen wiper
- PS12** Eleven* 1.2 x 4mm PB screws
- PS17** Three* 1.8 x 3mm PB screws

* Including spare

PB = Pan head for plastic

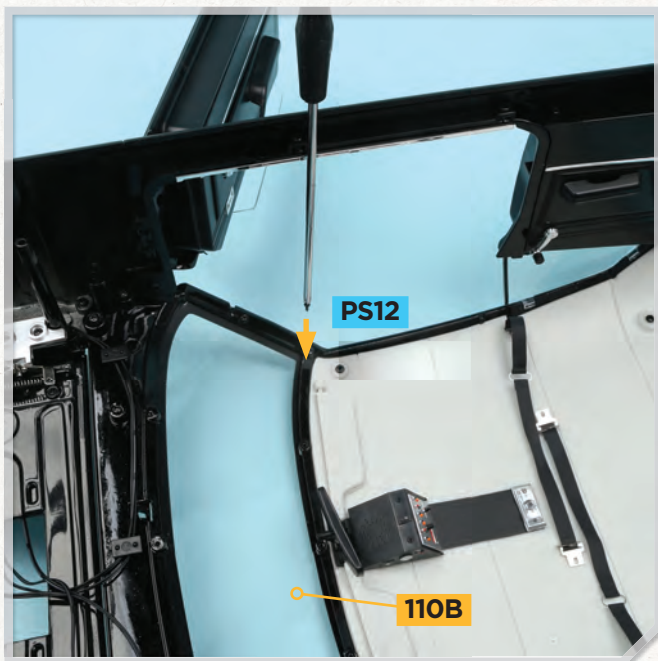
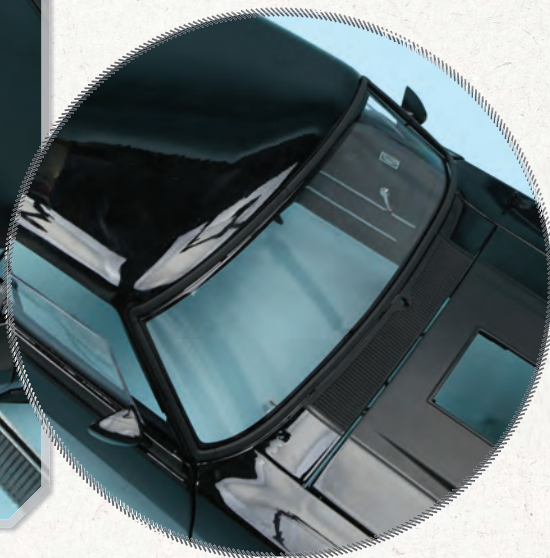


Stage 111: Windscreen Wipers



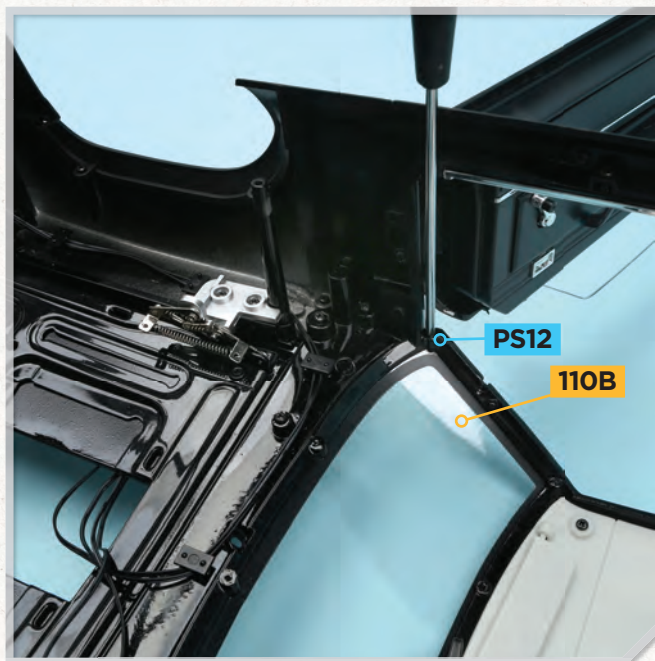
STEP 1

Fit the windscreen trim **111A** in place so that the raised screw sockets fit into the holes around the edge of the windscreen **110B** and it sits in the recess around the windscreen.



STEP 2

The windscreen is fixed in place using **PS12** screws, fitted from the inside to hold the windscreen **110B** and the windscreen trim **111A** in place. The first screw is fitted in the top left corner of the windscreen. The left door needs to be open for this process.



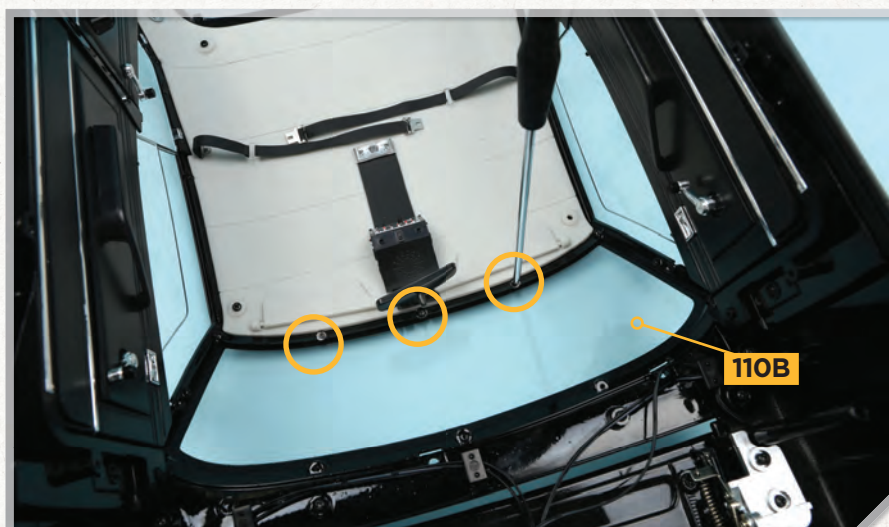
STEP 3

Fit a second **PS12** screw at the lower left corner of the windscreen **110B**.



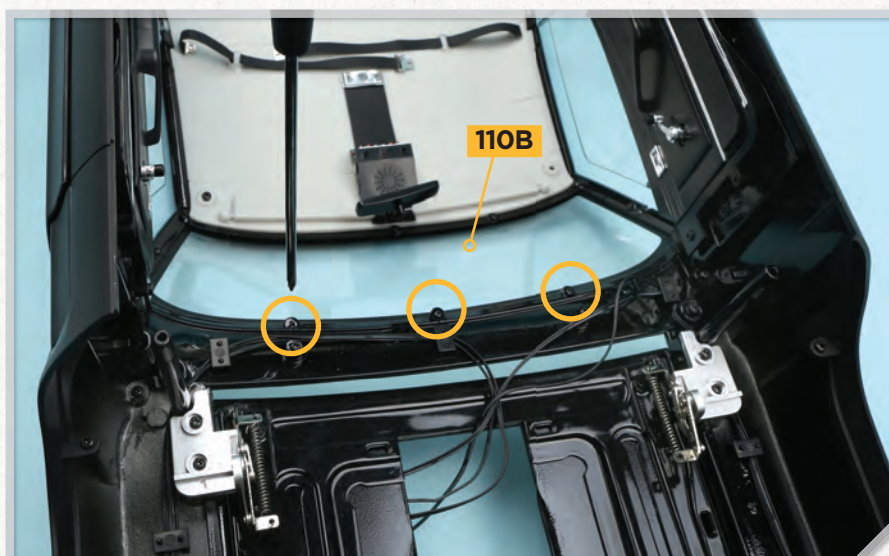
STEP 4

Similarly, fit two **PS12** screws in the corners of the windscreen **110B** on the right-hand side.



STEP 5

Identify three screw holes along the top of the windscreen (circled). Fix the upper edge of the windscreen **110B** in place with three **PS12** screws.



STEP 6

Similarly, fix the lower edge of the windscreen **110B** in place with three **PS12** screws.

Stage 111: Windscreen Wipers



STEP 7

Take the two windscreen wipers **111B** and **111C**. Note that they are marked L and R (circled).



STEP 8

Fit the socket on the end of part **111B** into the recess on the front of the left-hand side of the bonnet.



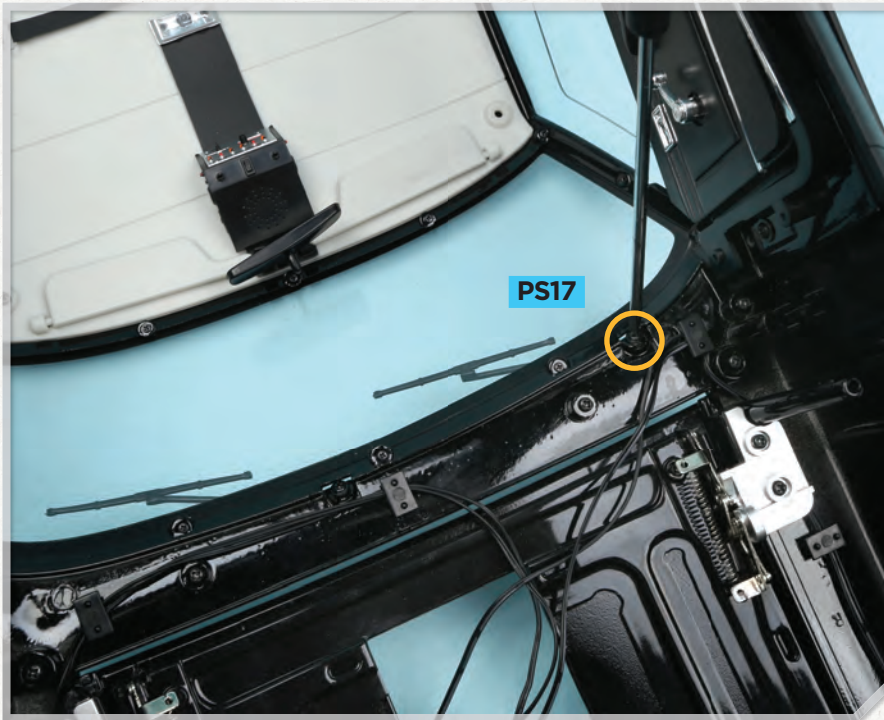
STEP 9

Holding the windscreen wiper in place, turn the assembly over so that you can fix the wiper in place with a **PS17** screw.

STEP 10

Similarly, fit the end of the right-hand windscreen wiper **111C** into the recess on the right-hand side of the bonnet.





STEP 11

Holding the wiper in place, turn the assembly over so that you can fix it in place with a **PS17** screw.

COMPLETED ASSEMBLY

The windscreen has been fixed in place and windscreen wipers have been attached.
