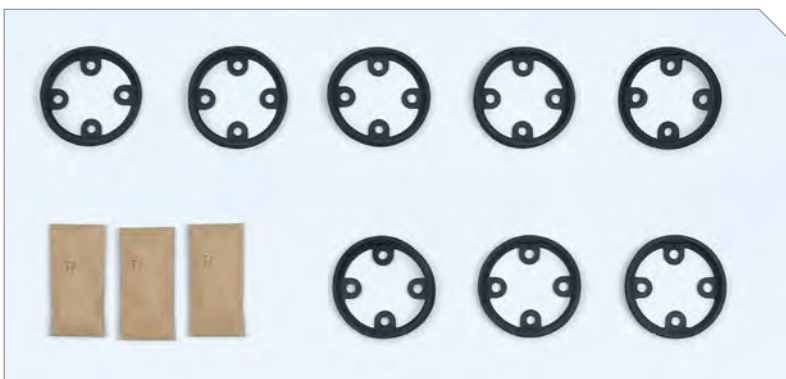

# THE TRAITORS

**Katarina makes the ultimate sacrifice to save the Solar System from the Daleks.**

**Season 3 Episode 13**  
**First Broadcast:**  
**4 December 1965**

**T**he Doctor tells Katarina to check on the airlock door. Katarina walks over to it, but it suddenly slides open, and she is grabbed by Kirksen. The Doctor yells at Kirksen to let go of the girl, but Kirksen ignores him and demands that they change course. "Go to the planet Kembel!" he says. The desperate man has his arm wrapped around Katarina's neck. "The Daleks are on Kembel!" Steven says. Kirksen ignores this warning. "Whoever the Daleks are, they'll help me!" he says. "I said go to Kembel! KEMBLE!"

On Kembel, the Dalek Supreme listens as the commander of the pursuit ship reports that they are able to continue to chase the *Spar*, which is heading for Earth. "Contact Mavic Chen through secret communication grid," it tells another Dalek. "He must recapture the taranium and exterminate creatures who took it." The Dalek Supreme orders the pursuit ship to return to base, but then turns to a Dalek and says, "Destroy pursuit ship. They have failed in their mission. We will not tolerate mistakes."

Bret and Steven pretend to change course for Kembel, but Kirksen is suspicious. Bret pushes a button, and the *Spar* lurches to one side. Before Steven can reach Kirksen, the convict pulls Katarina back inside the airlock and closes the door. The Doctor threatens to eject Kirksen into space. "Then the girl dies too," Kirksen replies. "If you open the outside door, then I'll push the inner release, and we'll all be dead!"

Kirksen realises what the brave girl is doing. Katarina hits the switch. The hull door opens, and she and Kirksen are blown into the cold vacuum of space. They die almost instantly. Steven screams, "KATARINA!"

Silence holds sway on the bridge of the *Spar*. The Doctor, Steven, and Bret can find nothing to say. "She wanted to save our lives," the Doctor finally says. "I hope she has reached that place of perfection."

Trantis confronts the Dalek Supreme, accusing it of failure. He demands to know what plans it has made with Mavic Chen to retrieve the taranium. "The Daleks will not fail!" the Supreme retorts.

The *Spar* approaches Earth. Bret says that they can't land in the main landing area. "Remember, this is Chen's space vessel," he says. He knows of an experimental plant not far from Central City: "I have a friend there I think will help us."

Mavic Chen stands in his office, studying a projection of Bret Vyon. With him are two aides, Lizan and Karlton. "So that's our traitor," Chen remarks. Lizan gives him a quick rundown of Bret's history with the Space Security Service. Chen orders that Bret's image be sent to all stations. Assuming that Kert Gantry is still alive and working with Bret, he orders that all SSS agents be recalled to Earth. "If the traitors are not caught at the landing zone, then Central City must be cordoned off until they're found!" he declares. Chen also orders Bret and Gantry to be killed on sight. Bret tells the Doctor and Steven that the *Spar's* drive



force is very weak, and they may crash on landing.

Chen paces around his office, barely concealing his fury over losing the taranium. Karlton enters. "I want that position right beside the Daleks," Chen tells him. "I'll govern the universe." Karlton points out that Trantis will be first in line, not him. Chen dismisses the thought. "The Daleks don't like him!" he scoffs. "They'll want him out of the way..." Karlton informs him that Kingdom is in command of the forces sent to capture Bret. Chen approves: "Ruthless. Hard. Efficient. And does exactly as ordered." Karlton receives a call and tells Chen that the *Spar* has crash-landed at the experimental station. Bret cautiously



"We've got to get Katarina out of there!" the Doctor shouts. Steven stares through the airlock door's window at Kirksen and Katarina, helpless and frustrated. "He can't kill her, or he hasn't a hostage," Bret says calmly. Steven shouts at Kirksen, calling him an animal. The Doctor turns to Bret, deadly serious. "Take him back to Kembel! Let the Daleks deal with him!"

Bret stares at the controls. "I can't sacrifice everything for the sake of that one girl," he says. As he and Steven argue, Katarina reaches for the outer release switch on the airlock. Too late,

Nicholas Courtney played Bret Vyon. "Douglas Camfield was very pro-me," he commented. "He was very much the kind of director who had particular actors he liked to work with. You see them pop up again and again." Courtney had almost appeared in an earlier *Doctor Who* story, also directed by Camfield: "[He] had first interviewed me for a part in another William Hartnell story about the Crusades, to play Richard the Lionheart, but I didn't get that. Julian Glover got that, but presumably Dougie didn't forget the interview, and when this part came along, he asked me to play it." The story's villains left him unperturbed: "I sort of keep my distance from the Daleks. I never really found them very frightening, certainly not in the stories I did with them." Courtney completed his work on *The Daleks' Master Plan* in four weeks: "To me, it was another job, an engagement for four episodes, and I thought, 'Well, that was fun,' and got on with it." Courtney had no idea at the time that he would return to *Doctor Who* as one of its most beloved characters, Brigadier Lethbridge-Stewart, and that his association with the series would last until the end of his life in 2011.

leads the Doctor and Steven through the corridors of the experimental plant. "No one here, we'll have to wait," he says.

SSS agent Sara Kingdom reports to Chen. She tells him that Bret and two strangers have been sighted inside the plant. "I'm going to capture them myself," she says. Chen says that there is something she needs to know...

Meanwhile, the Doctor, Bret, and Steven wait for Bret's friend, Daxtar. Bret says that they will need his help to clear their names. Daxtar appears.

Chen has told Sara about the taranium Core. She says that she will ensure its return, and leaves. "I was watching her



all the time," Karlton says. "She never doubted anything."

Daxtar finds Bret's story about Chen and the Daleks hard to believe but agrees to help. Daxtar suggests that they alert all the planets in the solar system and send a force to Kembel. The Doctor is unimpressed: "What price is Mavic Chen paying you for your treachery?" Daxtar has given himself away by asking about the taranium before they have mentioned it. At first indignant, he becomes fearful as Bret pulls out his pistol. "Traitor," Bret whispers, as he kills Daxtar in a blast of energy. The Doctor berates Bret for his ruthlessness: "Now we shall never know who we can trust!"

The Dalek Supreme receives a message from Chen, stating that the taranium Core will soon be retrieved and that he will be returning with it in two days. Chen also reports that the thieves came from Trantis' domain, the Tenth Galaxy, and were sent by him. Trantis denies this. "That is not true! It is a plot by Mavic Chen to discredit me!" he exclaims. The Dalek Supreme says that they will learn the truth when Chen returns.

Bret says that he will have to try to send the alert himself. The Doctor, Bret, and Steven turn to leave, but Sara Kingdom is at the doorway, blocking their path. She aims her gun at them. "Sara!" Bret says, delighted. "You're just the person we need!" Sara stares at him. "I doubt that," she replies. She turns to the Doctor and Steven. "Which of you has the taranium?" she asks. Bret shoves Sara aside. "Run for it!" he cries. The Doctor and Steven



escape, but Bret is trapped by Sara. "Give me the taranium!" she says. Bret believes that she is part of Chen's conspiracy. He reaches for his pistol, but Sara fires first. Bret falls to the floor, dead.

Sara searches Bret's body for the taranium but does not find it. She runs into the corridor and calls out to SSS agent Borkar, ordering him to seal off all exits to stop the Doctor and Steven from escaping. Borkar stares at Bret's body, shocked. Sara tells him that the other two fugitives are to be shot on sight...



## KATARINA?



Terry Nation had been told nothing of Katarina's background or even her name, so simply referred to her as "Vicki" (the previous companion) in his scripts. The draft script had Kirkland (later Kirksen) admiring Vicki's hair and slicing off a lock with his knife. He demanded to be taken to Venus, not Kembel. For the death scene, the description read: 'Photo caption of Vicki, a Mona Lisa-like smile on her face. Her hair streaming.' The original ending of the episode had Sara Kingdom finding the Doctor and Steven in a rocket room and saying that she must kill them.

## DEATH OF A COMPANION



*The Traitors* shocked viewers with the sudden deaths of both Katarina and Bret Vyon. While Katarina had initially been planned to be a new regular companion, producer John Wiles and story editor Donald Tosh had noted the difficulties in fitting her into a story being written by Paul Erikson. Katarina came from such a primitive time in history that even simple items, such as a key, had to be explained to her. Wiles and Tosh decided instead to include her in *The Myth Makers* but have her unexpectedly die in the following Dalek serial. Adrienne Hill was only contracted for five episodes of *Doctor Who*, and her first day of shooting at the BBC's Ealing studios included her death scene in *The Traitors*. She and Douglas Sheldon (Kirksen) were filmed jumping on trampolines against a back-projected starscape.

# DALEK TIME COMMANDER

During the period of Dalek history known as the Restoration Empire, a new rank of Dalek was created: the Dalek Commander.

**T**he Dalek Commanders were elite Daleks, fanatically loyal to the Dalek Emperor. Each Commander was the ultimate authority on any saucer ship it controlled, but with that authority came complete responsibility for any failure in a mission. For a Commander, failing the Emperor was the greatest shame imaginable, punishable only by a slow, agonising death.

Ripples in time were detected by the Daleks, and the Emperor realised that subtle changes were taking place in the Daleks' own history. Seeking more information, the Emperor led a force to the planet Islos and demanded access to its fabled Archive. Several Commanders were responsible for the full-scale invasion. The people of Islos retaliated by allowing an entity from another dimension [1] to enter this universe. The 'Entity' was a being composed of extraordinary energies never seen before in this reality and it nearly succeeded in completely destroying the Daleks.

The Entity's master was revealed to be the Hond: a species that had existed in the Universe's earliest period, known as the Dark Times. Though the Hond had long since become extinct, it had somehow been resurrected due to the disruptions in time. In response, many Commanders were dispatched across the universe to locate the Doctor, the Daleks' ancient enemy, and enlist his help in discovering the source of the temporal disturbances. They found the Doctor's eighth incarnation, who, once he grasped the danger threatening the fabric of the timeline, agreed to work with the Daleks. The enemies formed an uneasy alliance.

A Dalek Time Squad was assembled by the Emperor, and a temporal saucer was prepared for the mission. The Time Commander in charge was assigned Daleks of various ranks. In addition to the usual detachment of drones, there was a Scientist, a Strategist, and an Executioner. The Commander was well aware that if the mission failed, the Executioner would be the last Dalek it ever saw. The Daleks were unable to travel back to the Dark Times on their own, but with the aid of the Doctor's TARDIS and his skill at navigating time, the feat was successfully accomplished.

The Dalek Time Commander was given three missions by the Emperor. The first was to locate and exterminate the source of the temporal disruptions. The second was to collect specimens of creatures long extinct in their own era and harvest their genetic material, with the aim of

turning them into weapons for the Restoration Empire.

The Time Commander only became aware of the third mission when their journey into the Dark Times was well underway. The Eighth Doctor ultimately parted ways with the Dalek Time Squad. A recorded message

from the Emperor was projected to all the Daleks on the bridge of the time saucer. "This message has been recorded in case of your failure," the Emperor said. "It assumes you have failed to prevent the damage to our timeline. It assumes you have failed to prevent the Doctor from betrayal." The message continued: "The barrier

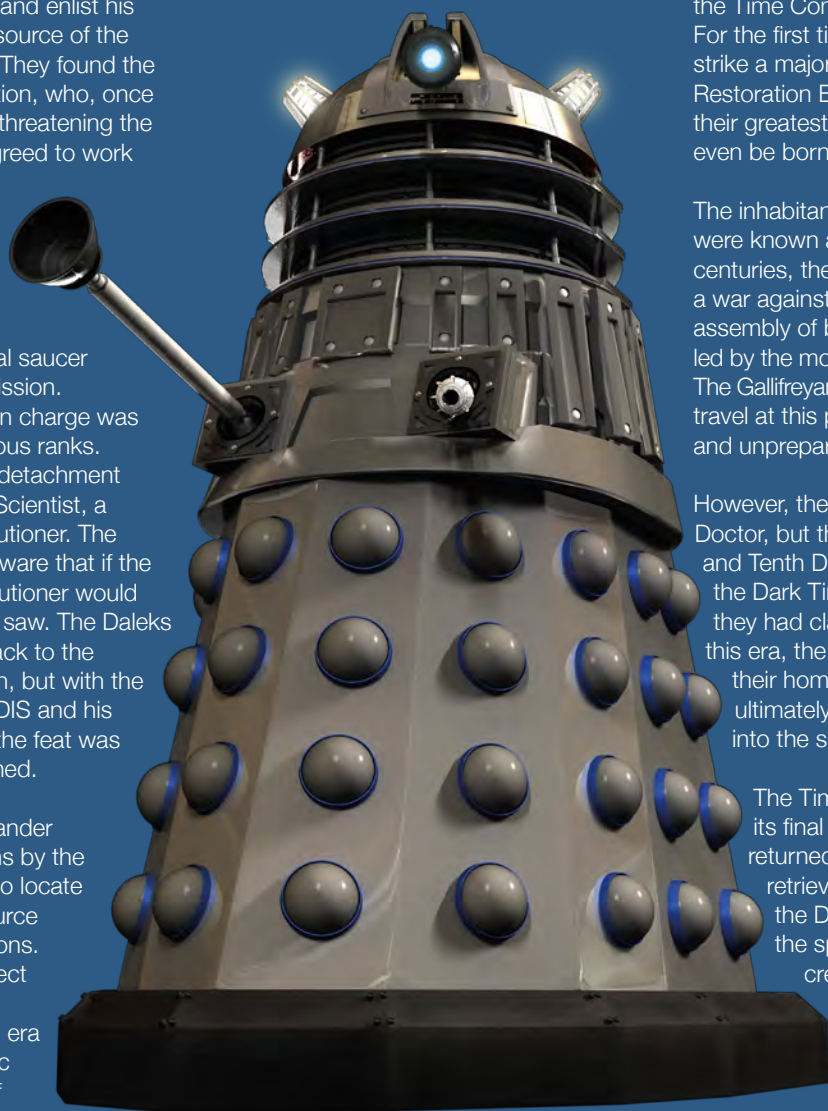
around the Dark Times has never been penetrated by the Daleks. Your presence in the Dark Times provides the Empire with an opportunity to secure the eternal victory of the Daleks." The image of the Emperor was joined by a slowly spinning world and the coordinates of its location. "This is the home planet of the Time Lords," the Emperor announced. "Gallifrey. I foresee a time when they will unite all life-forms." The Emperor began to shout, its voice growing increasingly louder. "They will seek to become the dominant creatures in the universe. They will do this by trying to destroy the Daleks. They will fail! You are ordered to return to Gallifrey at a point in time before the Time Lords evolve. I order you to avert their creation by destroying Gallifrey. The ultimate end."

The Daleks have no concept of redemption, but if they had, the Emperor's message would have given the Time Commander a sense of hope. For the first time, it had a chance to strike a major blow in the name of the Restoration Empire and eliminate one of their greatest opponents before they had even been born.

The inhabitants of Gallifrey at this time were known as the Space Lords. For centuries, they had been engaged in a war against the Vampire Alliance, an assembly of blood-devouring creatures led by the monstrous the Great Vampire. The Gallifreyans had no knowledge of time travel at this point and were ill-equipped and unprepared to face the Daleks.

However, the Daleks faced not one Doctor, but three. The Eighth, Ninth, and Tenth Doctors were all present in the Dark Times simultaneously. While they had clashed with each other in this era, the trio joined forces to defend their homeworld. The Daleks were ultimately defeated and blasted back into the space/time vortex.

The Time Commander had failed in its final mission. The Eighth Doctor returned to the time saucer to retrieve his TARDIS and prevent the Daleks from bringing back the specimens of the extinct creatures. The saucer was torn apart within the space/time vortex, and the Time Commander's failure was complete.

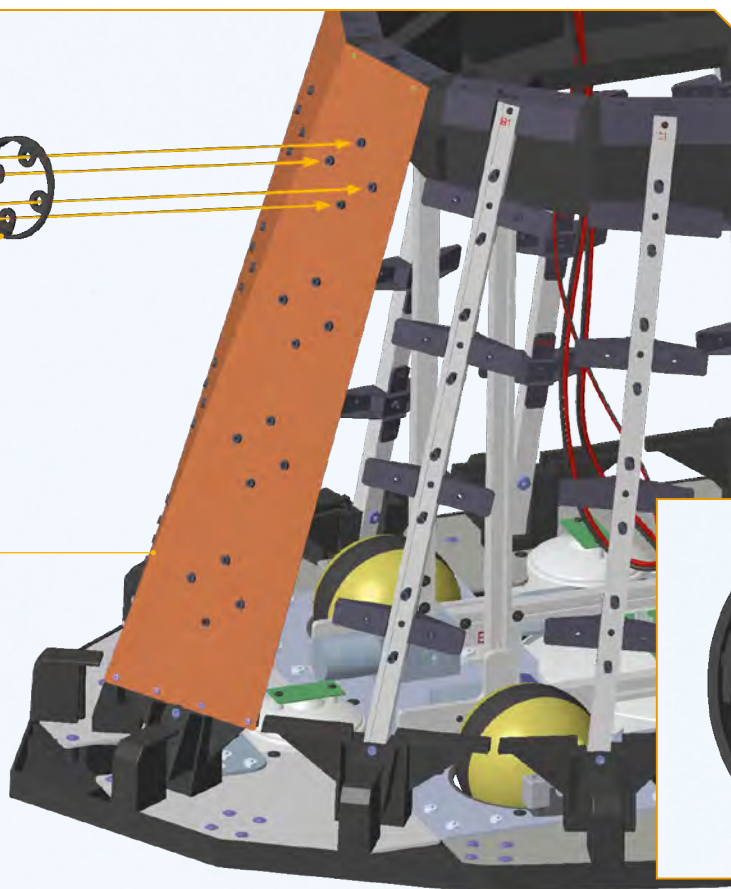

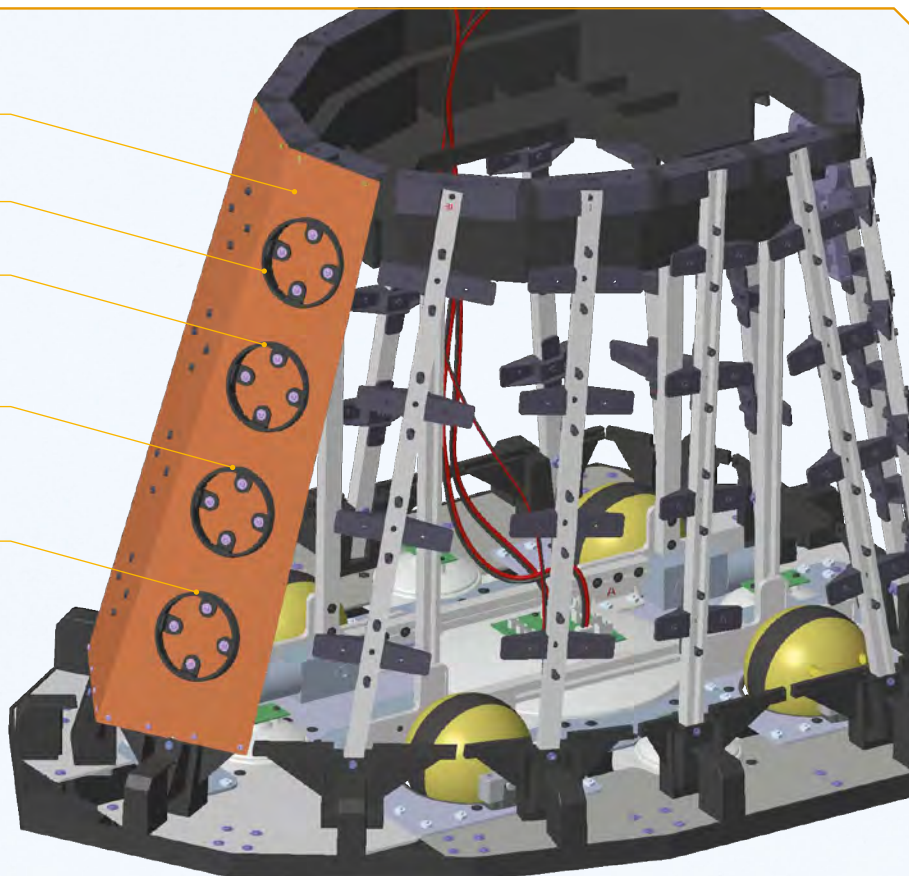

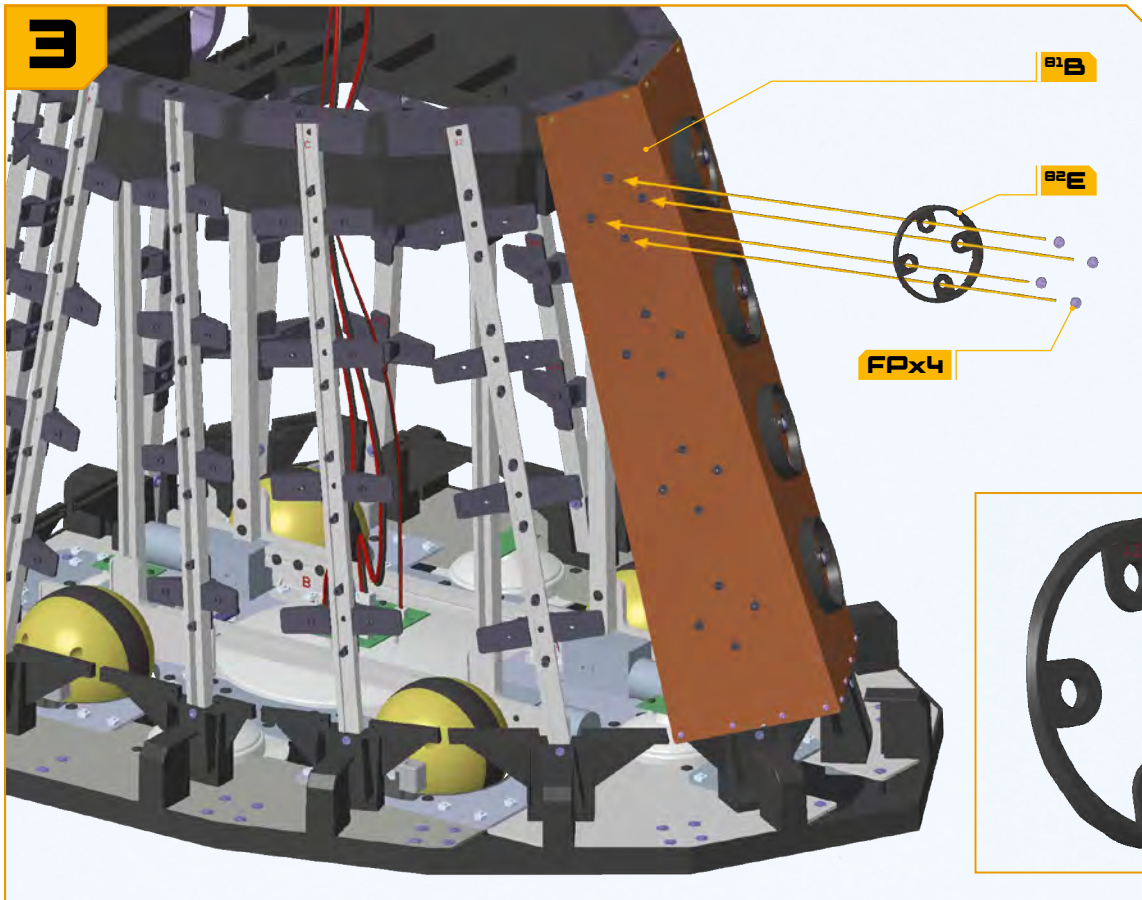
Take the ring **82A** (marked A1 1-1) and note the orientation: the top of the ring is marked A1 and the bottom is labelled 1-1 (inset). Positioning it with A1 at the top will ensure that the deeper side of the ring is towards the centre of the model. Fit the ring over the raised screw sockets on the top skirt holder, where they come through the panel **81A** (A1). Fix the ring in place with four **FP** screws.

**FPx4****82A****81A****2****#82-02**

Similarly fit the silicon rings **82B**, **82C** and **82D** over the remaining sets of raised screw sockets. Again, the label A1 should be at the top. Fix each ring in place with four **FP** screws.

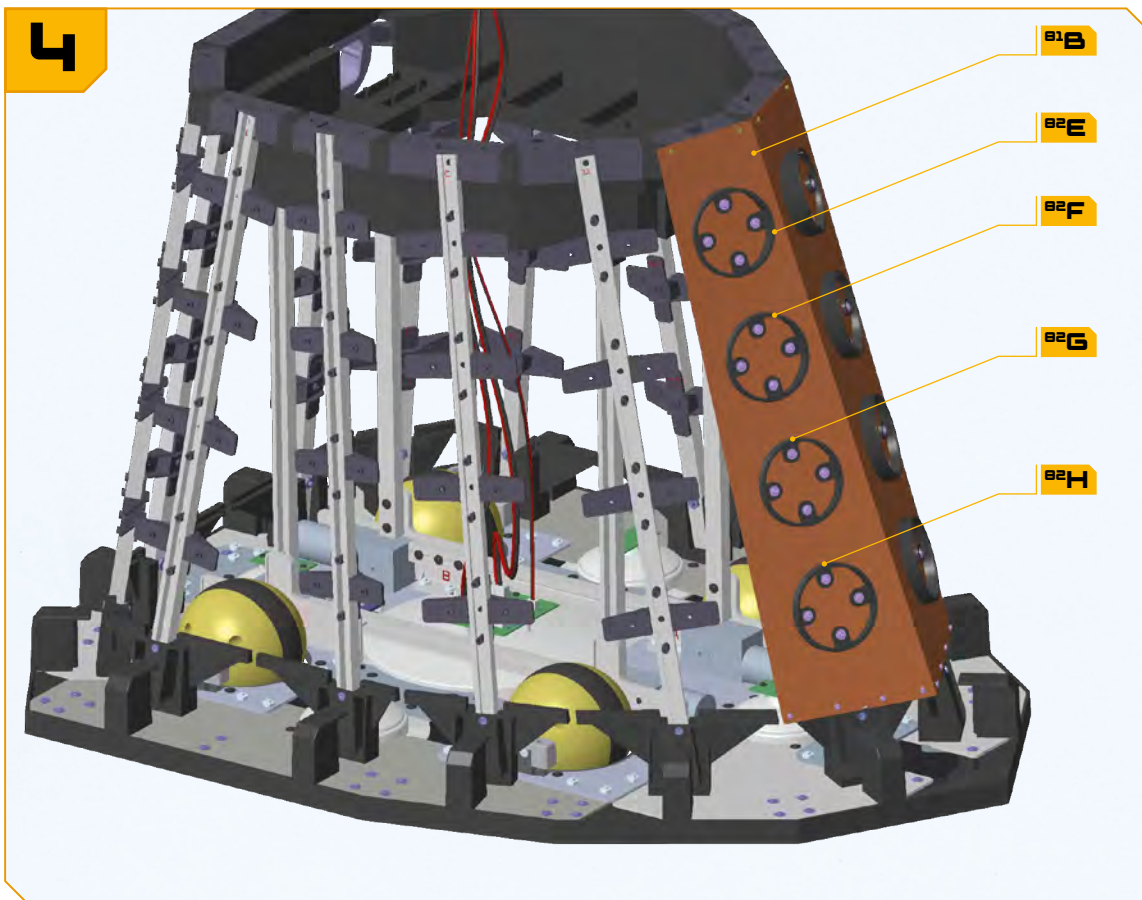

 Similarly, fit the ring **82E** (marked A2 2-1) over the raised screws sockets on the top skirt holder, where they come through the panel **81B** (A2). Check that you have the ring in the correct orientation, with A2 at the top (inset). Fix the ring in place with four **FP** screws.

 Fit rings **82F**, **82G** and **82H** over the remaining three sets of raised screw sockets that come through the panel **81B**, ensuring that the label A2 is at the top. Fix each ring in place with four **FP** screws.

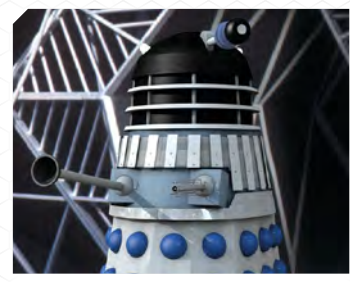

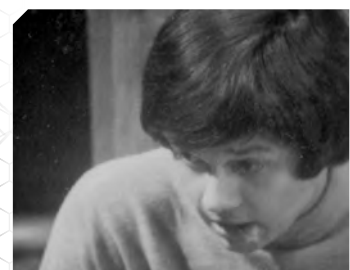
